SADDLE SEAT: Equitation By Grace Martin

Saddle Seat Equitation is a style of riding intended to show seamless compatibility between rider and horse. Equitation is not intended to be forced, but is intended to be graceful, useful, and efficient.

Hands

Hands "should show sympathy, adaptability, and control" (USEF Rule Book). They should be up, but determined by where the horse holds its head, and should be held in an easy position.

Legs and Feet

In Saddle Seat, the foot should be comfortably placed in the stirrup on the ball of the foot. The leg should be slightly bent at the knee, and in line with the rest of the body. Stirrup length should be determined by where the leg is positioned without the stirrup. Legs should not be forced, and toes should be slightly turned in or straight ahead. Heels should be down, and foot should be relaxed.

Seat and Overall Position

Rider should be comfortably in the saddle, with not too much room in front or behind. The rider

should sit straight with shoulders down, and looking over the horse's head.

Interesting Facts

+ Only 13 riders have ever won the Saddleseat Triple
Crown. Most recently, Macey Miles won in 2016, and
Haley Berget won in 2018.

+ The Saddle Seat World Cup is the highest level of competition for any eqitation rider.

HUNTER: Equitation

Hunt seat equitation is the art of riding a hunter horse. Hunter horses are used for jumping or flat riding, both for practice and in the show ring. In equitation, it is important to show your skills by showing your best performance, and also horsemanship. It is not a posing competition. It is the unique ability to show the best performance of both the rider and horse.

An equitation judge should be able to see an equitation rider's "tools" being used. Ideally, an equitation rider should exhibit strong legs, quiet and communicitive hands. There should be a special bond between a rider and horse shown throughout the performance.

There is power and unity in riding a horse.
Hunt seat shows a horse's power, and allows the horse to express themselves.

Fun Fact: Merin Maggi, trainer at Maggi Stables in Gilroy, California, won her first World Championship in Hunter Pleasure 13 & Under in 2002 - Unanimously!
